



In the Matter of Breach Hill Common,
Chew Stoke, Avon (NO. 1).

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land section of Register Unit No. CL 38 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Somerset County Council and is occasioned by Objection No. O/270 made by Mr J L Littlefair and noted in the Register on 22 April 1971.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Bath on 13 July 1978. The hearing was attended by the Objector, Mr A W James, an officer of the Avon County Council, and Mr D Heald, the Chairman of the Chew Stoke Parish Council. There was no appearance by or on behalf of any of the applicants for registrations in the Rights Section of the Register Unit in consequence of which this registration was made.

The Objection relates to only a small part of the land comprised in the Register Unit. In the absence of any evidence that the land to which the Objection relates falls within the definition of "common land" in section 22(1) of the Commons Registration Act 1965 I confirm the registration with the following modification:- namely the exclusion of the land the subject of the objection.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
