

In the Matter of Knowle Hill, Chew Magna,
Avon

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registrations at Entry Nos 2, 4, 5, and 8 in the Rights section of Register Unit No. CL 11 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Somerset County Council and is occasioned by Objection No 0/268 made by the Trustees of the Charity known as the Congregation of Our Lady of the Missions and noted in the Register on 21 April 1971.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Bath on 12 July 1976. The hearing was attended by Mrs S. V Pates, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 4, Mr and Mrs Millard, the applicants for the registration at Entry No. 8, and Mr J Brown-Rigg, solicitor, on behalf of the Objectors. There was no appearance by or on behalf of Mrs J D M Rawlins, the applicant for the registration at Entry No 2 or Mr R J Crane, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 5.

After Mrs Bates and Mrs Millard had given evidence Mr Brown-Rigg stated that he did not wish to pursue the Objection in respect of the registrations at Entry Nos 4 and 8.

In these circumstances I confirm the registrations at Entry Nos 4 and 8, and in the absence of any evidence I refuse to confirm the registrations at Entry Nos 2 and 5.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
