



In the Matter of Land near Ireby Village,  
Ireby, Cumbria (No. 1)

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DECISION

These disputes relate to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land section of Register Unit No. CL 473 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Cumbria County Council and are occasioned by Objection No. 138 made by Mr R Irving and noted in the Register on 4 August 1972 and the conflicting registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land section of Register Unit No. VG 22 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the Council.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Keswick on 10 November 1980. The hearing was attended by Mr B S Holmes, solicitor, on behalf of Mr Irving, and by Mrs P E Hind, Chairman of the Ireby Parish Council, the applicant for the conflicting registration. There was no appearance by or on behalf of Lord Egremont, the applicant for the registration.

The land comprised in the Register Unit consists of two distinct areas, one to the north-east and one to the south of the village of Ireby. The Objection relates only to the eastern portion of the land to the north-east.

Mrs Hind said that she did not wish to support the conflicting registration and that she was content for the land the subject of the Objection to be excluded from the Register Unit.

In these circumstances I confirm the registration with the following modification:- namely, the exclusion of the land the subject of the Objection.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
