

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

In the Matter of Skelgill Bank and Cat Bells,
Above Derwent

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land Section, Entries No. 1-22 in the Rights Section and Entries 1-3 in the Ownership Section of Register Unit No. CL 250 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Cumbria County Council and is occasioned by Objection No. 194 made by the National Trust and noted in the Register on 4 August 1972.

Mr Devlin for the National Trust, Mr G Barnes for Mrs A Barnes, Mr A Farrant of Messrs Watson Lewis and Co, Land Agents for Viscount Rochdale and Mr Nobbs of Oglethorpe and Hough, Solicitors of Keswick for Mr W A Layland.

Mr Devlin withdrew his objections to the Entries in the Land and Rights Section. He informed me that his client had acquired the interests of the other two applicants in the Ownership Section, and has produced documents of title which satisfy me that this is so.

For these reasons I confirm the registration at Entries No. 1 in the Land and Nos. 1-22, in the Rights Sections and at Entry No. 2 in the Ownership Section with the substitution for the particulars appearing in Column 4 of the words 'the whole of this register unit'. I refuse to confirm the registrations at Entry Nos. 1 and 3 in the Ownership Section.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
