



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No. 262/D/674-676

In the Matter of Whiteholme Common, Bowness

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DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land Section and at Entry Nos. 1-2 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No. CL 155 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Cumberland County Council and is occasioned by the conflicting registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land Section of Register Unit No. VG 48 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the Council.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Keswick on 2 July 1981. The hearing was attended by Mr Fryer Spedding instructed by Messrs Dickinson Dees, Solicitors of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, appeared for the Earl of Lonsdale in respect of his registration at Entry No. 1 in the Ownership Section of Register Unit VG 48 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the said County Council.

The conflicting registration has been withdrawn. The registration in the Ownership Section of Register Unit No. VG 48 in the Register of Town or Village Greens is deemed by Regulation 14 of the Commons Registration (General) Regulations 1966 also in this Register.

For these reasons I confirm the said registrations ~~with the following~~ in the Land and Rights Section and the registration in the Ownership Section deemed to have been made by Regulation 14 of the Commons Registration (General) Regulations 1966.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
