



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No.37/D/50

In the Matter of Two Pieces of Land at Lady's Wood,  
Chelwood Common, Danehill, East Sussex.

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No.1 in the Land Section of Register Unit No.VG 64 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the former East Sussex County Council and is occasioned by Objection No.211 made by the County Council and noted in the Register on 14th August 1972.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Lewes on 20th November 1974. The hearing was attended by Mr W.J.Clements, solicitor, on behalf of the East Sussex County Council and by Mr J.C.S.Nieboer, solicitor, on behalf of the Danehill Parish Council. The Ramblers' Association, which applied for the registration, was not represented, but before the hearing sent a letter to the Clerk of the Commons Commissioners stating that it was not desired to contest the Objection.

In these circumstances I refuse to confirm the registration.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
