



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No.13/U/54

In the Matter of Glasshouse Green,  
Taynton, Gloucestershire.

DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as Glasshouse Green, Taynton, being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No.CL.49 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Gloucestershire County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference no person claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no one claimed to have information as to its ownership.


I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Gloucester on 9th July 1974.

Mr. H.J. Thorpe, the Chairman of the Taynton Parish Council, appeared at the hearing, but he had no evidence as to the ownership of the land in question.

In the absence of any evidence I am not satisfied that any person is the owner of the land and it will therefore remain subject to protection under section 9 of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
