



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No 213/D/36 & 37

In the Matter of Wigmore Green,
Kings Stanley, Stroud D

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registration at Entry No 1 in the Land Section and Entry Nos 1, 2 and 3 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No CL. 5 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Gloucestershire County Council and are occasioned by Objection No 88 made by the Gloucestershire County Council and noted in the Register on 8 March 1971.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Gloucester on 15 October 1976. The hearing was attended by Mr Limbrick, Senior Legal Executive on behalf of the Gloucestershire County Council and by Mr Parker, Legal Executive on behalf of the Stroud District Council who registered the land as common land. None of the applicants for Rights appeared.

I was told that the registration of the land in the Land Section was made by reason of its being included in applications for rights over this and other units and a photograph was produced showing the land as being part of a made up road on which no grazing is possible.

Mr Parker was content that I should refuse to confirm the Entry in the Land Section and, in the absence of any claimants for rights, I refuse to confirm the Entry in the Land Section and Entries 1, 2 and 3 in the Rights Section.

I am required by regulation 50(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
