In the Matter of Monument Site, Langtoft Humberside (No 2)

DECISION .

is reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as Monument Site, angtoft, being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No CL 36 n the Register of Common Land maintained by the Humberside County Council of which person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 the owner.

ollowing upon the public notice of this reference no person claimed to be the reehold owner of the land in question and no one claimed to have information s to its ownership.

held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership f the land at Hull on 22 March 1977.

nere was no appearance at the hearing.

n the absence of any evidence I was not satisfied that any person is the owner of ne land, and it has therefore remained subject to protection under section 9 of the Act f 1965). After my decision was given I decided on the application of the Clerk f the Langtoft Parish Council to set aside my decision and re-open the hearing.

re-opened the hearing at Beverley on 15 January 1979. At the re-opened hearing ne Parish Council was represented by Mr D A R Watson, its Clerk.

n 1938 the Parish Council took possession of the land in question by placing a eat on it and has since remained in possession without any adverse claim, eplacing the seat when necessary. The Parish Council has therefore acquired a itle by adverse possession.

n this evidence I am satisfied that the Parish Council is the lowner of the land, nd I shall accordingly direct the Humberside County Council, as registration thority, to register the Parish Council as the owner of the land under ection 8(2) of the Act of 1965.

am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous n point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision s sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
