



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No.25/D/170

In the Matter of Leziate, Derby and Sugar Fens,Leziate and Grimston, Norfolk (No.1).DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No.1 in the Land Section of Register Unit No.CL.145 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Norfolk County Council and is occasioned by Objection No.13B made by the Grimston Fen Trustees and noted in the Register on 14th July 1969.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Norwich on 26th June 1974. The hearing was attended by Mr.P.H.Rippon, solicitor, on behalf of the Leziate Parish Council, whose application for registration was noted under section 4(4) of the Commons Registration Act 1965. The Norfolk Naturalists Trust, which applied for the registration, and the Objectors were not represented. However, the Norfolk Naturalists Trust had informed the County Council and the concerned authorities on 29th January 1974 that it would not pursue its application in respect of the land, known as Derby and Sugar Fens, which was the subject of the Objection.

This leaves the noted application of the Leziate Parish Council which does not include Derby and Sugar Fens, but does include land which was not included in the Trusts' application. The additional land includes Ordnance Survey No.120, which was also comprised in Register Unit No.CL.181 and was excluded from that Register Unit by my decision in In the Matter of Two Pieces of Land additional to Leziate Fen, Leziate (No.1) (1974), No.25/D/168, which excluded O.S.No.120 from Register Unit No.CL.181.

For these reasons I confirm this registration with the following modifications:- namely the exclusion of the land comprised in Ordnance Survey No.120 and Derby and Sugar Fens.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
