

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No. 25/U/94

In the Matter of Lord's Waste, Winterton-on-Sea, Blofield & Flegg R.D., Norfolk

## DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as Lords Waste (exclusive of the land which is hatched purple on Sheet 15 of the Register Map and which was removed from the Register pursuant to the Chief Commons Commissioner's decision dated 3 August 1972, reference 25/D/12), Winterton-on-Sea, 3lofield and Flegg Rural District being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No. CL.47 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Norfolk County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference no person claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no person claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Norwich on 20 March 1974. No person attended the hearing.

In the absence of any evidence I am not satisfied that any person is the owner of the land and it will therefore be subject to protection under section 9 of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 5 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the Miga Sourt.
