



In the Matter of the Pinfold, Worksop Road,  
Blyth.

DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of the land above mentioned being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No. CL.50 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Nottinghamshire County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference Blyth Parish Council claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no other person claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Nottingham on 28 February 1985.

Mr J Healey (Clerk) and Mr B L Waplinton (a member) appeared on behalf of the Parish Council.

Mr Healey produced a print of the Blyth Inclosure Award of 1814 in which the land is described as a new Pound and allotted as a Common Pound for the Township and Liberty of Blyth

For these reasons I am satisfied that Blyth Parish Council is the owner of the land, and I shall accordingly direct the Nottinghamshire County Council, as registration authority, to register Blyth Parish Council as the owner of the land under section 8 (2) of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
