



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No.229/D/3

In the Matter of Wolvercot Common,
Oxford, Oxfordshire (No.1).

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No.29 in the Rights section of Register Unit No.CL 2 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Oxford County Borough Council and is occasioned by Objection No.6 made by Mr F.J.Cuddiford and noted in the Register on 12th August 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Oxford on 9th October 1975. The hearing was attended by Mr E.T.Coker, solicitor, on behalf of Mr A.H.Holifield, the applicant for the registration, and by Mr J.Cole, solicitor, on behalf of the Objector.

The ground of the Objection is that Mr Holifield is not entitled to the right which he has registered because he is not a resident householder in the parish of Wolvercot.

The material facts of this case are the same as those in In the Matter of Port Meadow, Oxford, Oxfordshire (No.1) (1975), Ref.No.229/D/1, and for the reasons set out in my decision in that case I confirm the registration.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
