In the Matter of Gelli Felew Llanelly Hill

DECISION

This dispute relates to the register unit at Entry Nos. 3,8,912,14 and 33 in the Rights section of Register Unit No.CL.35 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Powys County Council and is occasioned by Objections made by the Duke of Beaufort's Breconshire Estate Commoners Association and noted in the Register.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Brecon on 29th March 1984. The hearing was attended by Mr Dawson of Henry Jones and Hogg solicitors of Swansea who appeared for the Objectors. Mr Dawson said the Objections to the first three applications had been made because the rights of grazing claim exceeded the number of sheep or stock equivalent 5 sheep or 1 horse or 1 beast per acre of dominant land. The three applicants had agreed to reduce their claims and on the basis the objections would be withdrawn and I was invited to confirm the three registrations subject to such reductions.

Rights Entry No. 3 reduced to 85 sheep or stock equivalent 8 10 " 9 20 "

No one appeared in support of the remaining three applications.

For these reasons I confirm the registration at Entry Nos. 3,8 and 9 with the modifications mentioned and I refuse to confirm the registrations at Entry Nos. 12,14, and 33.

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commmons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous <u>in point of law</u> may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
