



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

In the Matter of (1) part of Albury
Downs, Guildford Borough and (2) land
north of Winterfold Heath, Albury Parish
and Guildford Borough, Surrey

DECISION

These references relate to the question of the ownership of lands being (1) part of Albury Downs, Guildford Borough and (2) land north of Winterfold Heath, Albury Parish and Guildford Borough, comprising (according to the Register) (1) 1.493 hectares and (2) 3.250 hectares and being the lands comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit (1) CL. 533 and (2) CL. 537 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Surrey County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference the Albury Trustees claimed to be the freehold owners of the lands in question and no other person claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Guildford on 13 January 1977. At the hearing (1) Rt Hon the Earl of Halifax and (2) Most Hon the Marquess of Linlithgow (the present trustee of the Albury Estate) were represented by Mr H A Lee, Surveyor of the Estate and their Agent assisted by Miss E I Lowe solicitor with May May & Merrimans, Solicitors of Grays Inn, London. Mr Lee and Miss Lowe also represented Rt Hon the Earl Percy in whose favour a vesting deed is in the course of preparation.

Miss Lowe in the course of her evidence produced: (1) an abstract of the title of the Earl of Halifax and the Marquess of Linlithgow to freehold hereditaments in Albury beginning with a vesting deed dated 19 February 1927 in favour of A I 8th Duke of Northumberland (he died 23 August 1930) and ending with the probate dated 9 August 1965 of the will of H M Duchess of Northumberland (she died 13 June 1965), (2) the said 1927 vesting deed; (3) a copy of the relevant part of the plans and schedule therein referred to; (4) probate dated 8 October 1930 of the said 8th Duke; (5) a vesting deed dated 14 December 1931 in favour of the Duchess and (6) the said 1965 probate.

Mr Lee in the course of his evidence produced agreements dated 19 June 1962, 30 December 1966, 1 May 1970 made between the Albury Trustees and the Surrey County Council under section 60 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 providing for public access to a large area of land including and around Newlands Corner; he also produced deeds of declaration dated 20 March 1967 and 15 July 1968 made between the Albury Trustees and the Forestry Commissioners



dedicating lands on Winterfold Heath for forestry purposes. Mr Lee said (in effect): The CL. 533 land is part (being at the west end) of the Newlands Corner area being included in the said 1970 access agreement. The CL. 537 land is self-regenerated Scots pine similar to the surrounding lands and is included in the said 1968 Deed of Dedication.

The CL. 533 land and the CL. 537 land are shown on the 1927 vesting deed plans being part of the land shown in the Schedule as "22.237 (acres) Pt of St Martha's Down" and "143.792 (acres) Winterfold Heath".

On the evidence summarised above I am satisfied that the Earl of Halifax and the Marquess of Linlithgow are the owners of these lands and I shall accordingly direct the Surrey County Council as registration authority to register the Rt Hon Charles Ingram Courtenay Earl of Halifax of Garrowby, Yorkshire and Most Hon Charles William Frederick Marquess of Linlithgow of Hopetown House, Queen's Ferry, West Lothian, Scotland as the owners of the lands under section 3(2) of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
