



In the Matter of Blackheath Common, Wonersh,
Surrey

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registrations at Entry Nos 1 to 4 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No. CL.179 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Surrey County Council and are occasioned by objection No. 295 made by the former Hambledon Rural District Council and noted in the Register on 7 October 1970. Objection No. 619 also made by the former Hambledon Rural District Council and noted in the Register on 3 July 1972. and Objection No. 427 made by the former Surrey County Council and noted in the Register on 19 October 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Guildford on 21 March 1980. The hearing was attended by Mr E C J Wells, Solicitor, on behalf of the Trustees of the late Lord Tangley, and Lady Tangley, the successor in title of Mr R J Bevington, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 2, by Col. R Hume, the successor in title of Ms E M Sudbury, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 3, by Mr R Hart, Solicitor on behalf of the Waverley District Council, the successor authority of the former Hambledon Rural District Council. and by Mr B E H Cotter, Solicitor, on behalf of the Surrey County Council. ~~There was no appearance by or on behalf of Mrs L M Burne and Ms C P Pike, the applicants for the registration at Entry Nos. 1 and 4.~~ *appeared in person*

I was informed that it was agreed that the registrations at Entry Nos 1, 2 and 3 should be confirmed.

In these circumstances I confirm the registration at Entry Nos 1, 2 and 3 and I refuse to confirm the registration at Entry No. 4.

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
