



In the Matter of Headley Heath,
Headley, Surrey (No. 2)

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registrations at Entry Nos. 1 to 3 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No. CL 89 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Surrey County Council and are occasioned by Objection No. 148 made by the former Surrey County Council and noted in the Register on 1 September 1970 and Objection No. 279 made by the National Trust and noted in the Register on 7 October 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Guildford on 14 December 1979. The hearing was attended by Mr R Cotter, Solicitor, on behalf of the Surrey County Council and by Mr A Groat, Solicitor, on behalf of the National Trust. There was no appearance by or on behalf of the applicants for the registrations.

The Solicitors for Mr H R Fortescue, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 1, stated in a letter dated 31 October 1979 addressed to the Clerk of the Commons Commissioners that he would abandon his claim.

Mr Groat informed me that the National Trust did not wish to pursue Objection No. 279 in so far as it related to the registration at Entry No. 2.

The Solicitors for Mrs J Murrey, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 3, stated in a letter dated 11 December 1979 addressed to the Clerk of the Commons Commissioners that she would withdraw her claim.

In these circumstances I refuse to confirm the registrations at Entry Nos. 1 and 3, and I confirm the registration at Entry No. 2.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
