

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965:

Reference No. 203/D/82

In the Matter of The Village Green, Cheddington, Buckinghamshire

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land Section of Register Unit No. VG 53 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the Buckinghamshire County Council and is occasioned by Objection No. 18 made by Trustees of the Oxford Diocesan Council of Education and noted in the Register on 14 October 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Aylesbury on 27 June 1978. The hearing was attended by Miss J Morgan, Solicitor, on behalf of the Objectors. There was no appearance by or on behalf of the Cheddington Parish Council, the applicant for the registration, but I was informed that the Parish Council had agreed to accept a 99-year lease of the land at a peppercorn rent and was no longer concerned to support the application. I was therefore asked to adjourn the hearing until the lease had been granted.

The Clerk of the Commons Commissioners was informed by a letter dated 20 October 1981, from the Clerk of the Parish Council that the lease had been formally completed and that the Council no longer wished to pursue the application.

In these circumstances I refuse to confirm the registration.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
