

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No.204/3/20

In the Matter of Hilton Green. Hilton, Cambridgeshire (No.6).

## DECISION

This dispute relates to the registrations at Entry Nos.1-13 in the Rights section of Register Unit No.VC 56 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the former Huntingdon and Peterborough County Council and is occasioned by the conflicting registration at Entry No.1 in the Land section of Register Unit No.CL 4 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Council.

I hold a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Cambridge on 22nd October 1975. The hearing was not attended by any person entitled to be heard. The dispute is, however, merely a technical one caused by conflicting registrations in the Land sections of Register Units Nos.VG 55 and CL 4. Since it has been agreed between the parties concerned that the registration in the Land section of Register Unit No.CL 4 should be confirmed and that the conflicting registration in the Land section of Register Unit No.VG 56 should not be confirmed, it only remains for me to refuse to confirm the registrations the subject of this dispute.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
