

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No.204/D/11

In the Matter of The Common, Little Wilbraham, Cambridgeshire.

## DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No.1 in the Ownership section of Register Unit No.CL 5 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Cambridgeshire and Isle of Ely County Council and is occasioned by Objection No.71 made by the Little Wilbraham Parish Council and noted in the Register on 29th October 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Cambridge on 23rd October 1975. The hearing was attended by Mr E.W.Wells, the Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council. There was no appearance by or on behalf of Mr F.W.W.Pemberton, the applicant for the registration, but in a letter dated 17th October 1975, addressed to the Clerk of the Commons Commissioners, Messrs Walters Vandercom and Hart, solicitors, stated that they were instructed by Mr Pemberton to "withdraw" his claim to the ownership of the land comprised in the Register Unit.

There being no evidence in support of the registration, I refuse to confirm it.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
