

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No. 206/D/545

In the Matter of Goss Moor, St Dennis, Cornwall (No. 2)

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registrations at Entry Nos.1, 3 (now 7), and 4 (now 8) in the Rights section of Register Unit No. CL 237 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Cornwall County Council and is occasioned by Objection No. X 1202 made by George Hugh, Viscount Falmouth and noted in the Register on 31 October 1972.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Truro on 28 February 1979. The hearing was attended by Mr J G R Romary, Solicitor, on behalf of Mr A C Burnet the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 3 (now 7) and the successor in the title t Mr A B Robins, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 4 (now 8), and by Mr J B G Holt, Solicitor, on behalf of the Objector. There was no appearance by or on behalf of Mr J H Chapman, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 1, but Mr Chapman's Solicitors informed the Clerk of the Commons Commissioners by a letter dated 18 January 1979 that he did not wish to support the registration. Mr Romany and Mr Holt informed me that been agreed that the registration at Entry No.3 (now 7) should be modified so that it would be limited to 25 cattle instead of 20 heifers and 20 steers, and that the registration at Entry No. 4 (now 8) should not be confirmed.

In these circumstances I refuse to confirm the registrations at Entry Nos. 1 and 4 (now 8 and I confirm the registration at Entry No. 3 (now 7) with the following modification, namely, the substitution of "25 cattle" for "20 heifers and 20 steers".

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explai that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
