



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT, 1965

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registrations at Entry No. 1 on the Land Section and at Entry No. 1 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No. CL 517 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Cornwall County Council and is occasioned by Objection No. X 363 made by Mr William John Alexander Lemon Williams and noted in the Register on 1 April 1971.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Camborne on 6 October 1980. At the hearing Mr W J A L Williams was represented by Miss B Beak solicitor with Emlbys, Solicitors of Redruth; and Mr W C Partridge on whose application the Rights Section registration was made, attended in person.

The registration in the Land Section was made in consequence of the application for the Rights Section registration, being of a right to graze 35 head of cattle and 14 pigs. The grounds of Objection are (in effect) that the land in this Register Unit was not common land at the date of registration.

Mr Partridge said (in effect):- He had never put either cattle or pigs on the Common, nor had his predecessors. He considered that for him to go on with these proceedings would be a waste of time. He agreed that the registrations resulting from his application should be cancelled.

No one contending of the contrary, I conclude that the registrations should not have been made, and accordingly I refuse to confirm them.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
