In the Matter of The Foreshore, Bowness, Cumbria (No. 3)

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Ownership section of Register Unit No. CL 381 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Cumbria County Council and are occasioned by Objection No. 121 made by Mr J Paisley and Objection No. 156 made by the British Railways Board and both noted in the Register on 4 August 1972.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Keswick on 11 November 1980. The hearing was attended by Mr J Fayer Spedding, of counsel, on behalf of the Earl of Lonsdale, the applicant for the registration, by Mr P W Pickles, solicitor, on behalf of the personal representatives of the late Mr Paisley, and by Mr D Stubbington, an officer of the British Railways Board.

The land in which Mr Paisley's clients are interested, together with other land, has been excluded from the Register Unit by my decision in <u>In the Matter of The Foreshore</u>, <u>Bowness</u>. <u>Cumbria</u> (1980), Ref. Nos. 530 - 532, and there is no land belonging to the British Railways Board comprised in the Register Unit.

There is therefore no outstanding objection to the registration in so far as it relates to the land still comprised in the Register Unit.

For these reasons I confirm the registration.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
