



In the Matter of Various Pieces of Land in the  
Parish of Ireby, Cumbria.

## DECISION

These disputes relate to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land section of Register Unit No. VG 22 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the Cumbria County Council and are occasioned by the conflicting registrations at Entry No. 1 in the Land section of Register Unit No. CL 473 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Council and at Entry No. 1 in the Ownership section of the same Register Unit.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Keswick on 10 November 1980. The hearing was attended by Mrs P E Hind, the Chairman of the Ireby Parish Council, the applicant for the registration. There was no appearance by or on behalf of Lord Egremont, the applicant for the conflicting registrations. However, Mrs Hind said that she could not support the registration, since the land was unsuitable for sports and pastimes, though her Council wished to have a part of the land comprised in the Register Unit registered in the Register of Common Land.

In these circumstances I refuse to confirm the registration.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
