In the Matter of The Town Hard (part), Waltonon-the-Naze, Essex

## DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of the land known as The Town Hard (part), Walton-on-the-Naze, being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No. CL 22 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Essex County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference the Frinton and Walton Town Council claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question, and the Essex County Council claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Colchester on 30 November 1982.

At the hearing the Town Council was represented by Mr J P McLarney, its Clerk.

In 1962 the former Frinton and Walton Urban District Countil placed a notice board claiming ownership on the land the subject of the reference. In 1963 the Council gave-permission to the members of the Walton Town Hard Association to carry out works of improvement. During the course of the works 12 tons of mud were removed and new material put in. Since then the members of the Association have re-shingled the Hard every three or four years. They have also constructed a small quay and renewed mooring chains. No permission from anyone other than the Council was sought and the work was done without any complaint.

In my view the Urban District Council acquired a possessory title to the land.

On 1 April 1974 the Urban District became part of the District of Tendring. The land did not, however, pass to the Tendring District Council, since effect was given to an agreement to its transfer to the Parish Council (now the Town Council) of Frinton and Walton outside the general rules by an extension to Schedule 1 of the Local Authorities (England)(Property etc.) Order 1973 (S.I. 1973 No. 1861) in a supplementary transfer of property order laid before Parliament.

On this evidence I am satisfied that the Frinton and Walton Town Council is the owner of the land and I shall accordingly direct the Essex County Council, as registration authority, to register the Town Council as the owner of the land under section 8(2) of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
