In the Matter of Two Additional Pieces of Land at Brockeridge Common, Twyning, Gloucestershire.

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land section of Register Unit No CL 394 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Gloucestershire County Council and is occasioned by Objection No. Ob. 591 made by Mr B C Ball and noted in the Register on 8 January 1973.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Cheltenham on 25 November 1980. The hearing was attended by Miss Sheila Cameron, of counsel, on behalf of the Objector.

Miss Cameron informed me that she was instructed not to pursue the Objection, but she produced a form of consent signed by or on behalf of all the parties entitled to be heard, which requested me to confirm the registration, but to add the land comprised in the Register Unit to Register Unit No. CL 265. The object of this was apparently to render the land comprised in this Register Unit subject to the registrations in the Rights section of Register Unit No. CL 265, there being no entry in the Rights section of the Register Unit.

In my view, I have no jurisdiction to add to the land comprised in a Register Unit land which was not mentioned in the application in consequence of which the land was registered. This being so, my only course is to confirm the registration without modification.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in moint of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
