## In the Matter of Bramley Green, Bramley, Hampshire.

## DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as Bramley Green, Bramley, being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No.VG 112 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the former Hampshire County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference no person claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no one claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Winchester on 22nd May 1975.

At the hearing Mr J.D. Fleming, solicitor, appeared on behalf of the Trustees of the Duke of Wellington's Personal Estate, as defined in section 2(1) of the Wellington Estate Act 1972 (c.1, personal).

Ir Fleming produced copies of schedule C and plan B referred to in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Act of 1972, and I am satisfied from these documents that the Trustees are the owners of the land. I shall accordingly direct the Hampshire County Council, as registration authority, to register them as the owners of the land under section 8(2) of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
