

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference Nos 15/D/12 15/D/13· 15/D/14

In the Matter of Shiel Meadow, Richards Castle, Leominster District, Hereford and Worcester

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registration at Entry Nos 1, 2 and 3 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No CL. 121 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Hereford and Vorcester County Council and are occasioned by Objection No 388 made by Mrs E M Turner and noted in the Register on 28 January 1971.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Hereford on 28 January 1976. The hearing was attended in person by Miss Cecilia Mary Price and by Mr Horris Alfred Sparey (Entries Nos 1 and 2 were made on their application), and Bilbury Farm Limited were represented by Mr G H Rickards solicitor of Phillips & Co, Solicitors of Ludlew.

At a hearing in Hereford on 12 December 1975, I considered a dispute relating to Entry No 4 in the same section of the same Register Unit and occasioned by the same Objection. In my decision dated 14 March 1974 I set out the facts as then proved before me relating to the land comprised in this Register Unit; it then appeared that Bilbury Farm Limited under a conveyance dated 5 August 1971 became, in succession to Mrs Turner, the owner of the land in respect of which she made the Objection. For the reasons set out in my said decision, I confirmed the registration at Entry No 4 without any modification.

Mr Rickards at this 1976 hearing, suggested that I now give the same decision as regards Entry Nos 1, 2 and 3. For the reasons which appear in my 1974 decision, I consider I should give effect to this suggestion. Accordingly I confirm the registrations at Entry Nos 1, 2 and 3 without any modification.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
