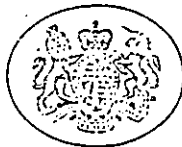


COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965



Reference No. 219/U/44

In the Matter of Fowlers Stone Green,
Meopham, Kent

DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as Fowlers Stone Green being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No. VG 138 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the Kent County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference Meopham Parish Council claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no other person claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Maidstone on 6 February 1979.

Mr J Carley, Chairman of Meopham Parish Council, appeared on its behalf: no one else appeared at the hearing. The Parish Council claimed ownership of the land but the only evidence adduced was to the effect that it had controlled and maintained the land for some eleven years.

On this evidence I am not satisfied that any person is the owner of the land, and I shall accordingly direct the Kent County Council, as registration authority, to register Meopham Parish Council as the owner of the land under section 8(3) of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
