



COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No.2/U/19

In the Matter of The Forty,Cholsey, Berkshire.DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as The Forty, Cholsey, being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No.V.G.33 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the Berkshire County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference no person claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no one claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Reading on 10th October 1972.

At the hearing Mr. J.R.F. Davis, the Chairman of the Cholsey Parish Council, produced a conveyance dated 24th June 1913, whereby James Archibald ^{Morrison} Harrison conveyed to the Parish Council the lordship of the manor of Cholsey and the land known as The Forty.

On this evidence I am satisfied that the Parish Council is the owner of the land, and I shall accordingly direct the Berkshire County Council, as registration authority, to register the Cholsey Parish Council as the owner of the land under section 8(2) of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
