## In the Natter of Hunger's Green, Monk Soham, Mid Suffolk D.

## DECISION

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as Hunger's Green, Monk Soham, Mid Suffolk D., being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit To.CL.13 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former East Suffolk County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference no person claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no one claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Inswich on 27 January 1976.

There was no appearance at the hearing.

Mr D J Feall did by letter notify the Commons Commissioners that he would have wished to claim ownership of the land as Lord of the manor of Crowland but was unable for lack of evidence to put that claim forward at the hearing.

In the absence of any evidence I am not satisfied that any person is the owner of the land, and it will therefore remain subject to protection under section 9 of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1371 to explain that a person aggriced by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
