



In the Matter of Blindley Heath, Godstone,
Tandridge D

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registrations at Entries Nos. 1 to 5 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No. CL 15 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Surrey County Council and are occasioned by three Objections, Nos. 176 and 495 made by Godstone Parish Council and noted in the Register on 4 September 1970 and 24 February 1971, and No. 407 made by Surrey County Council and noted in the Register on 10 October 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the disputes at Oxted on 25 June 1981. The hearing was attended by Mr T H Bassett, a member of and representing Godstone Parish Council, and by Mr B E H Cotter, Solicitor, of Surrey County Council. A letter had been received from the Solicitors to Mr and Mrs Pinney, successors to the applicant for registration at Entry No. 1, stating that they did not wish to proceed with the application: none of the other applicants was present or represented. In the absence of evidence in support of the applications, I refuse to confirm the registrations.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
