

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No. 270/D/49-50

In the Matter of Oakworth Moor Oakworth

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registrations at Entry No 1 in the Land and Rights Section of Register Unit No.CL.600 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former West Riding County Council and is occasioned by Objection Ho. 353 made by Margaret Joyce Feather Robert Leigh Feather and Kenneth Wilfrid Oxley and noted in the Register on 20 April 1971.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Bradford on 10 February 1931. The hearing was attended by Mr Pepper peppeared for Eradford City Council. Mr D V Evans of Messrs. Simpson Curtis and Co., Solicitors of Leeds appeared for the objectors and Mr Simpson appeared for the Yorkshire Water Authority.

I was informed that all parties had agreed that I should confirm both registrations subject to the following modifications. These should be excluded from the Register Map

(i) Any land lying to the south of the red line indicated on the plan attached to objection No. 353 dated 28 September 1970 and

(ii) the land described as 'the property' in a Conveyance made the 20 February 1939 between the Chatsworth Estates Company of the first part, the Most Noble Edward William Spencer 10th Duke of Devonshire of the second part and the Mayor Alderman and Burgess of the Borough of Keighley of the third part and coloured pink and edged with a red verge line on the plan . thereto.

All parties agreed that the Register Unit was part of Keighley Moor and that the description 'Oakworth Moor' was not correct.

For these reasons I confirm the registration with the said modifications.

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to emplain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of less may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
